AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF BARI ALDO MORO AND THE UNIVERSITY OF RAI UNIVERSITY

The University of Bari Aldo Moro, situated at Piazza, Umberto I – 70121, Bari (Italy), represented by the Rector *Antonio Felice Uricchio* and Rai University, Ahmedabad situated at Saroda, Dholka Taluka, Ahmedabad, Gujarat – 382260, India represented by the Deputy Provost, Dr. Charu Acharya, agree to establish a mutually beneficial relationship between the two universities and to develop academic and cultural interchange in the areas of education, research, and other activities.

Areas of cooperation:

The areas of cooperation will include any program offered at either university which is felt to be desirable and feasible for the development and strengthening of cooperative relationships between the two institutions. However, any specific program shall be subject to mutual consent, availability of funds, and approval of each party. Such programs may include:

- a. Exchange of teachers, researchers, technical and administrative staff
- b. Exchange of undergraduate, graduate, doctoral and post-doctoral students
- c. Joint research projects
- d. Joint conferences
- e. Joint cultural programs
- f. Exchange of academic materials, publications, and other documentation.

Rules:

The terms of such mutual assistance and cooperation shall be discussed and agreed upon in writing by the appropriate responsible officers of both parties prior to the initiation of any particular program or activity.

Executive protocols and agreements will be drawn up jointly by a Commission made up of the Rector, or his delegate, as coordinator, and of two professors for each University. They will describe precisely the cooperation forms to develop and will indicate the budget estimate which thereafter will be approved by the Government Bodies.

The validity of this agreement is subject to the conditions and recommendations of the academic approval process of both parties being satisfied; its terms may be amended at any time by mutual written consent of both parties.

The present agreement will come into force following the date of the last signature and will have a term of three years.

The agreement may be renewed for further periods by mutual written consent of the parties; however, after the initial period either party may terminate the agreement by giving six months notice in writing of such intent. The parties agree to solve in a friendly manner any controversy rising from the interpretation of the present agreement.

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Annexure I

Discover India policy and guidelines for having international affiliation

Our Student Exchange Program aims to provide broad based benefits to students where they get the opportunity to seek international exposure and acquaint themselves with new cultures and global educational standards. Such activities are important part of overall development of a student giving them awareness and help adopt alternative, multifaceted approaches to learning.

Following policy will apply to students going abroad or coming from any university under student exchange program:

Outbound Exchange Program:

- ✓ The interested student must propose Rai University their name for the student exchange program. Such requests are considered and forwarded through the Department of International Affairs. They will have to submit their CV with a request application. It may also be followed by a personal interview.
- ✓ Tuition fee may or may not be charged by the host university.
- ✓ All expenditures (lodging, ticket, etc) of outbound exchange students will be borne by students themselves. Other associated costs & personal expenses will also be taken care by the student.
- ✓ The student must adhere to departure and return dates as specified by the University.
- ✓ Students chosen for this program should have minimum 65% score in the previous semester exam.
- ✓ Students who have studied at least one year (two semesters) will be considered for this program.
- \checkmark The student should be fluent in English language.
- ✓ You will continue to pay tuition fees to Rai University.

Inbound Exchange Program:

- ✓ Inbound exchange program will only be allowed for students from international educational institutes/universities which are recognized and have signed the MOU with Rai University.
- ✓ The decision for enrolling students under inbound exchange program will be taken by Rai University. Interested students must send their CVs with a request application.
- ✓ The student must submit a letter ensuring consent of his/her home university to study at Rai University under exchange program.
- ✓ The student must be a regular student of his/her home university.
- ✓ All expenditures (lodging, ticket, etc) of inbound exchange students will be borne by students themselves.
- ✓ Tuition fee will be charged as per prevailing rate for the courses studied at Rai University.


